Dear Parents of a Young Child

Thank you for your participation in our H1N1 clinics – they were a great success. Over 16,000 children were vaccinated. **About one third of these children are under 10 years of age and require a second booster dose.** Placer County Health and Human Services has an adequate supply of vaccine. You may bring your child into one of the clinics identified below or to your health care provider. Additional clinics are being scheduled in Southern Placer County. More information will be available on the county website as sites and dates are finalized.

Information for parents of children needing an H1N1 Booster:

- ❖ A booster (second dose) is required if your child is under 10 years of age no matter what type of vaccine he/she received for the first dose
- ❖ There must be at least 21 days between the first and second dose – a longer time period is acceptable
- ❖ The live, nasal vaccine is in very limited supply. Your child may receive a different type of H1N1 vaccine than he/she received for the first dose. It is not necessary that both immunizations be of the same type (nasal or injectable).
- ❖ Please bring the immunization card with your child to the clinic.
- ❖ Some clinics have been scheduled for specific school districts for booster doses. Other clinics are open to community members. You may choose to attend either the clinic for your district or a community clinic. Family members may be vaccinated at either clinic as well.
- ❖ There is no charge for these vaccinations
